## FELLOWSHIP TO SERVE IN THE LORD'S MOVE

- In 1991, to initiate the work in the Russian-speaking world, Brother Lee asked those who were burdened to emigrate and serve full time to fill out an application and submit it to a group of brothers for their evaluation.
- The service that this group of brothers has continued to perform since then, and the extended service of receiving and disbursing funds to support the work in the former Soviet Union, Europe, and Israel, became known as Lord's Move to Europe (LME).
- LME is not a separate incorporated entity; it functions financially under the church in Anaheim.
- Since the beginning of the Lord's move in the Russian-speaking world, those who have been led by the Lord to participate in the Lord's move in the above-named places in the way of full-time service, have been asked to submit an application to LME. Those who are burdened to study, take a job, or retire to live and serve in these places have been invited to inform LME of their burden mainly for the purpose of fellowship.
- An application for those who are burdened to serve full time and an information form for those who intend to study, take a job, or retire in the above-named places can be downloaded on this web page. If possible, please fill out the forms in English or ask someone to translate your information into English.
- All applicants for full-time service should carefully follow the instructions on this web page. Each application must be accompanied by a recommendation from the elders or responsible ones in the church, the work, or the full-time training in which the applicant has been serving.
- Each applicant who applies for full-time service is carefully considered based on his or her previous service in the church life, the work, or the training, equipping in the divine truths and living of a God-man life, and human factors such as health.
- In Brother Lee's view the most important qualification for one to serve in the Lord's work is willingness and ability to coordinate (cf. Acts 15:37-40).
